An up-and-coming jazz tenor saxophonist, composer, and performer Kyle Bramson is influenced by John Coltrane, Micheal Brecker, and Wayne Shorter but has a sound and style of his own within the mainstream of modern jazz.

He has performed with numerous jazz artists: David Detweiler, Luis Hernandez, Leon Anderson, Jalen Baker, and more.

Kyle has performed in numerous venues across the state of Florida and continues around Tallahassee. In his free time, he likes to competitively race sailboats for FSU.
